## North Central and Caribbean World Masters Athletics Championships

Many Canadians and Americans went to Puerto Rico now for the second year in a row to compete. Many of us had great concerns over how well the meet would be run. Nearly all of those concerns were unfounded. It turned out that only transportation would be a problem. The officiating of the meet was at the highest level. Awards flowed into Canadian hands. Every Canadian earned at least one medal. The big groups were Puerto Rico, Mexico, USA and Jamaica. Several non-region athletes also attended from Brazil, Panama, Argentina, Guyana, Great Britain and Ireland.

There were 106 women and 279 men. The women competed in more events than the men. The highlight of the meet was our own Olga Kotelko. She won 10 gold metals with at least three World records all at age 85. Even the mayor praised her in his speech.
