CANADA SURRENDERS FLEISHMAN TROPHY TO THE USA

n a not so epic battle Canada gave up the Fleishman trophy at the annual Can-Am cross-country challenge. The 1998 event was held on Canada's Thanksgiving weekend in Rochester New York over a rolling five kilometre course in great conditions. Thirteen Canadian men, but unfortunately no women, traveled to Rochester for the event which was also the USATF National Masters Five Kilometre Championship.

There were 139 finishers in the men's race with Stouffville, Ontario's Fred Robbins the first Canadian in a time of 16:53.
